

CIBC FIRSTCARIBBEAN MAKES \$25,000 PURCHASE TO SHIELD FRONTLINERS FROM COVID-19

Nassau, Bahamas, 1 May 2020 - With a number of relief assistance offers already made available to eligible clients, CIBC FirstCaribbean is now directly supporting frontline healthcare workers in the fight against COVID-19.

The bank purchased locally \$25,000 worth of personal protective equipment (PPE) to help meet the critical needs of the healthcare workforce.

CIBC FirstCaribbean has provided the government with thousands of plastic face shields to protect doctors, nurses, and many other medical professionals as they battle against the coronavirus pandemic. The PPE was produced by local manufacturer, The Sign Man.

"We recognize the essential role of frontline medical professionals in maintaining a strong healthcare system. In hospitals, clinics, and homes around The Bahamas, these individuals unwaveringly continue to care for patients," said Managing Director of the bank Mrs. Marie Rodland-Allen.

She continued: "Aware of the risks presented, the face shields donated are for their added protection as they continue to defend the health and safety of our country. Healthcare workers have our deepest gratitude and admiration."

"These face shields couldn't come at a more opportune time," said Minister of Health Dr. Duane Sands accepted the donation on the government's behalf.

He noted that the bank had a huge presence in The Bahamas, with a commitment to the country and the wider Caribbean region where it supports various f community health initiatives like the annual Walk for The Cure.

The recent \$25,000 purchase follows prior efforts made by CIBC FirstCaribbean in its commitment to assist the community.
