CIBC FirstCaribbean Announces Return of Walk for the Cure with \$55,000 Donation

Nassau, Bahamas, 26th **July 2022** - Longtime and new supporters of CIBC FirstCaribbean's flagship fundraiser, Walk for the Cure (WFTC), will take on streets across New Providence, Grand Bahama, Abaco and Eleuthera in less than three months.

Following two years of alternative fundraising activities, the bank recently announced the return to the usual in-person walk on October 1st and encourages everyone to participate by stopping by any CIBC FirstCaribbean branch, or by emailing WalkfortheCureBAH@cibcfcib.com to register.

The funds generated from the walk are used primarily to assist with the purchase and maintenance of equipment used in the diagnosis and treatment of cancer patients. They are also used to provide assistance, care and counselling to patients and their families as well as to raise awareness, and stress the importance of early detection, through education campaigns across the region.

"Walk for the Cure is our opportunity to raise funds for several cancer care organisations throughout The Bahamas, and at the same time, provide a community for anyone who has been impacted by cancer. Unfortunately, that is most if not all of us here in The Bahamas. So, whether you are currently fighting cancer, a survivor, or a family member, friend or loved one, we invite you to join us as we walk for the cure," said CIBC FirstCaribbean's Marketing Manager and Walk Manager, Nikia Christie.

"On October 1st, registrants will interact and walk with other participants at a safe distance while enjoying fresh air and great scenery. They can make it a team activity by signing up with friends, family members or co-workers," she said.

Mini health fairs with exhibitors and exciting vendors will immediately follow the Walk for the Cure events on the four islands.

Since the walk's inception in 2011, CIBC FirstCaribbean has raised just over half a million dollars for the fight against cancer with the help of its amazing corporate sponsors, employees, clients and members of the public.

CIBC FirstCaribbean's Managing Director, Dr. Jacqui Bend, appealed to corporate Bahamas to partner with the bank to support Walk for the Cure and help raise critical funds to support those impacted by cancer. She said the goal is to reach \$100,000 in donations this year.

"The last two years have been difficult for all of us. And as you can imagine, it has also been difficult for the cancer care organisations that we support through Walk for the Cure who have seen a decrease in donations, and an increase in need," she said.

"This is why we continue to give, even in a challenging environment. In fact, despite not having a physical walk event for the past two years, we made an effort to conduct several Walk for the Cure fundraising activities. With the lockdowns and other restrictions, our employees and committed sponsors still managed to raise significant funds for the cancer care charities and organisations who are doing great work in our communities. We're hoping to double that amount this year."

During the walk's 2022 launch event, the \$55,000 raised during the COVID-19 pandemic was presented to Sister Sister Breast Cancer Support Groups of New Providence and Grand Bahama, Cancer Society of the Bahamas, Cancer Societies of Abaco, Eleuthera and Grand Bahama, Cancer Association of Grand Bahama and GD Sharing and Caring.

Walk for the Cure 2022 sponsors to date include Bahamas Waste, Bahamas Wellness, Grand Bahama News and 242NewsBahamas.
