CIBC FIRSTCARIBBEAN'S WALK FOR THE CURE PRE-EVENT A SUCCESS

St. John, Antigua, 3 May 2022 - Neither rain nor the threat of rain could stop the intrepid hikers as they set off along the trails at the Wallings Nature Park. This was the start of one of the pre-events in the build-up to the eleventh anniversary edition of CIBC FirstCaribbean's Walk for the Cure.

Last Saturday 30th April, the bank hosted Hike for the Cure at the Wallings Nature Reserve. 151 persons registered for the hike.

Natasha Charles, one of the bank's organisers said that the idea of this hike started last year as due to the restrictions caused by the Covid pandemic, a way had to be found to maintain the focus on the well-known cancer walk.

"We are so happy that with the apparent waning of Covid, things will return to normal so that we will once again be able to host our Walk for the Cure as usual. We will be hosting a number of events which, in addition to being fundraisers, will also help to create interest for the main event which is the Walk for the Cure to be held in early October.

Ms. Charles thanked all those who participated in the Hike especially the larger groups from Sagicor Life and General, Galley Bay and A.S. Bryden & Sons which registered the largest group of 40 hikers and also provided Milo beverages and snacks for the hikers.

The region's largest cancer fundraiser, CIBC FirstCaribbean's Walk for the Cure, celebrates 11 years this year.

Walk for the Cure began as part of the celebrations to mark the bank's 10th anniversary and takes place across its 16-member footprint. It has raised millions of dollars over the past ten years. The funds generated from the walk are used primarily to assist with the purchase and maintenance of equipment used in the diagnosis and treatment of cancer patients.
