### BANK EMPLOYEES CLEAN UP SAM LORD CASTLE'S BEACH

**Bridgetown, Barbados, 21 September 2022.** - From as early as 6:30 a.m., last Saturday morning over sixty (60) employees of CIBC FirstCaribbean, their children and friends turned up on Sam Lord's Castle Beach, St. Philip, well gloved, armed with garbage bags and geared up to clean the beach.

Three hours later, the beach and seashore shone with natural beauty having been freed of hundreds of kilogrammes of ugly, unhygienic litter that either was brought by waves or was unceremoniously dumped by people using the beach area as a picnic spot.

When they left the beach, the specially installed skip for this cleanup had some 41 bags of garbage weighing 2356.71 kgs.

From a gas cylinder to a boat hull, pieces of metal, wood, and fishnets, as well as a car headlight, food containers, plastic bags and cutlery, bottle caps and beverage bottles were found among the debris that littered the 0.41 km of beach cleaned on Saturday.

The bank's effort which coincided with International Coastal Clean-up Day, which is observed annually on the third Saturday of September, was held under the coastal clean-up programme of the Caribbean Youth Environment Network Barbados Chapter.

The Chapter's National Coordinator, Shannon Weekes described the effort as extremely commendable, adding that it was a good choice to clean an easterly beach since such beaches do not receive a lot of attention and the number of bags of garbage collected affirmed the wisdom of that choice.

Noting the attitude of CIBC FirstCaribbean to the clean-up, she said she hoped the bank's participation would signal to other corporate entities the importance of becoming directly involved by bringing people to clean-up. She said ensuring that the environment was kept clean should not be seen solely as the responsibility of environmental organisations or people in the field but that of everyone, and that by coordinating clean-up efforts, corporate entities would also help to raise the level of responsibility among people.

It was not the first time CIBC FirstCaribbean was engaged in a coastal clean-up. The bank's Managing Director for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean, Donna Wellington said protocols related to the COVID -19 pandemic had led the bank to temporarily remove the activity from its outreach agenda. "We, at FirstCaribbean, are very interested in making sure that we do our part to support environmental issues in Barbados and across the region", she said, pointing to the bank's involvement in the Blue Bond for Marine Conservation.

She explained that the bank, working with the Barbados Government, has completed a transaction for the bond which is backed by the Inter-American Development Bank and Nature Conservancy. She said

that CIBC was participating in half of that bond from which BBD 100M in interest savings would be used toward coastal and environmental matters over the next 15 years.
