STUDENTS JOURNEY THROUGH THE SUMMER WITH AN INSPIRATIONAL BOOK

Bridgetown Barbados 27, July 2022: During the current long summer holidays, scores of teenagers will have the opportunity to read the inspirational book, 'Journey to Thirty, the Naked Truth, I am You', written by a young Barbadian woman, Kimisha King.

She relates how she overcame adversities during her teens into young adulthood growing up in a dysfunctional family.

Fourth and fifth-form girls of Princess Margaret Secondary and St. George Secondary Schools recently got the opportunity to engage with King during special 'meet and greet" end of term sessions at their schools when, they received autographed copies of the books as gifts.

The books were purchased with support from CIBC FirstCaribbean.

During the sessions, King, who is also Chief Executive Officer of Queens' Mindset, described the book as a frank account of her life, pointing out that it touched on relationships and events and as a result, she ruffled some feathers causing her to lose some friends and upset some relatives.

However, the author said her faith in God and her desire to encourage and empower young people fuelled her will to produce the book. She added that it would be a source of inspiration to them, giving hope, that similar to her, they could rise above challenges, find their identity and live their true lives. She told the students that the book was written in a conversational style which they should find appealing.

The students also received words of encouragement from CIBC FirstCaribbean's, Director of Retail Banking Channels, Michelle Whitelaw who quoted Sir Winston Churchill, a famous former Prime Minister of Britain who said "We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give," and she asked the students to think on that statement.

Referring to the book's title, Whitelaw said she knew students might have been saying they were nowhere near 30 since they were teenagers, but she explained that the books would serve them well since all they did now, would impact them as they grow.

"All the good that you do, or all the bad that you do, can follow you as you grow and mature. So, you want to ensure that you do good, help someone along the way, join a club and do some community work and use these books well to help you as you move on," she added while urging them not to simply put their copies away but to read them.

"There are many areas touched on by Kimisha in her book including 'how to find purpose' and 'how to love yourself and find your worth and value and most importantly 'how to trust God,' now don't you think that is worth reading about?" she asked.

"Find ways in which you can be a better person, ways in which you can give, ways in which you can help. We at the bank are giving you these books and we are asking you to pay it forward by giving or helping someone else," the senior bank official said. She ended with a quote from Albert Schweitzer who said, "Even if it's a little thing, do something for those who need help, something for which you get no pay, but the privilege of doing it."

The author asked the students for feedback on the book and the librarian at St George, Sonia Callender, said she would encourage the children to read it and share their reviews.


