Castries, Saint Lucia, November 24th, **2023** – The Boys Training and Centre (BTC) and the St. Mary's College (SMC) were the focus of CIBC FirstCaribbean International Bank's community outreach for the celebration of International Men's Day 2023.

The day, which is observed every November 19, celebrates worldwide the positive value men bring to the world, their families and communities. With this year's theme promoting "Zero Male Suicide", the bank brough the message of encourage and a commitment of support to the young men of these two institutions.

On Friday November 17th, ahead of the international observance, CIBC FirstCaribbean's Country head -Nigel Ollivierre, Branch Manager -Smerna Pompelis, Business Support Officer-Cafeita Ephraim and Police Officer Foster Chicot treated the wards of the BTC to lunch at the Centre at Massade. Gros Islet.

In a bonding session after lunch, Mr. Ollivierre encouraged the boys to look beyond their current situation, "envisage the tomorrow you want, and diligently work towards that dream, because our ambition and our vision for the future starts in the imagination, and is then watered by our drive and passion." Officer Chicot also shared a few words of advice, highlighting the Centre's pledge as a good creed they should take to heart, to make positive changes. The session ended with the presentation of personal care packages.

Also, in observance of International Men's Day, the St. Mary`s College was the recipient of XCD 1500.00 from the bank. The cheque presentation was done by bank staffers Aaron Joseph and Tristan Frederick – both past students of the institution. According to SMC Principal Leo Fontenelle, the funds will be used to purchase of a printer for printing examination papers for the students.

Mr. Ollivierre said the selection of two Boys institutions at seemingly opposite ends of the spectrum by the bank was to highlight that men's vulnerability to depression, fear and discouragement is caused by factors that are often unrelated to socio-economic circumstances.

"We are invested in doing what we can as a bank to build that kind of awareness both within the bank and in the community. We believe it's critical to use our platform to dismantle old norms and stereotypes. We wanted to bring the message to our boys that it is normal and important to support each other;" Mr. Olivierre concluded.

Trends as reported by the World Health Organization indicate that men are disproportionately affected by suicide. Statistics in 2021 showed that men died by suicide 3.90 times more than women, highlighting the need address male suicide and promote male mental health.
