#### STUDENTS IMPRESSED WITH BANK'S AI TECHNOLOGY

**Bridgetown, Barbados, April 19, 2023** - "It is funny how you can spend a lot of money or most of your money without knowing, just because you are not mindful," a ten-year-old student of Good Shepherd Primary School remarked after visiting CIBC FirstCaribbean's booth at the Science and Technology Festival, held recently at the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus.

A few minutes earlier, she had played the money game at the bank's booth. In the game, students were given \$100 to purchase items from a list of toys and snacks and were urged to make wise choices. When her purchases were totalled, she was amazed at how quickly her money was spent and that some students were left with little money and others with none.

So, she concluded, "I have learnt from my mistake; you have to be conscious of what you are doing when you are buying things. I thought I had so much money." she added.

Shane Prescott, Analyst, People Change Management at the bank said the aim was to help children recognise the value of managing money responsibly and to do so in a manner that was fun while doing everyday exercises.

In keeping with the festival's theme "Resilience: Purposeful Innovation for Sustainable Living", the bank's booth also exposed visitors to knowledge about Artificial Intelligence (AI). This was demonstrated by an animation featuring AI Tiffany, a character which was fully generated by AI. Prescott said that the AI was told what the occasion was and what the bank wanted to achieve.

Prescott said that the idea was to show visitors to the booth how technology was advancing, how banking is being reimagined and how technology can be leveraged to achieve these innovations and make banking more sustainable. He said that AI produced the name, Tiffany, the image, the animation, the artwork, her comments and the scripts which included one tailored to the 5-12 age group and another to older students.

Students, especially those at the secondary level were impressed by the AI Tiffany and the functions of Artificial Intelligence (AI).

A few weeks after the festival, the winners of the competitions at the festival were invited to CIBC FirstCaribbean to accept their prizes in a short ceremony where Trevor Wood - Director - Data, Wealth and Corporate Centre Technology - explained why the bank got involved in a Science Festival.

He explained that the team wanted to make the future visible and tangible for visitors to the booth by allowing them to view and listen to Tiffany. He added the bank also wanted to create interest in financial literacy through play for the children visiting the booth. They also wanted to hear what the public had to say about digital and innovative banking and exactly what it meant for them.

Prizes were tablets donated by Promotech Inc. and the display was organised and executed by The Technology and Innovation Forum (TIFF) department at CIBC FirstCaribbean.
